Ofsted

In January we were visited by an Ofsted Inspection team I am delighted to share with you the outcome of our most recent inspection:

The academy has improved so significantly that the special measures judgement has been removed and the academy has been judged as overall 'requires improvement' with three 'good' judgements. We are delighted that the inspection team could see the incredible improvements that are happening and what a transformed place it is to work and learn. The inspection team were particularly impressed with the behaviour, personal development and leadership within the academy. They also noted significant improvements to the curriculum that were tangible and making a difference.

Strike Days

As you will be aware from my previous letters, the NEU union continues to take strike action aimed at the government to look at both the funding for schools and teachers' pay and conditions. There are currently ballots taking place and I will update you on any further strike action in due course.

Year 11

Year 11 students have recently completed their PPEs and are working incredibly hard to achieve their targets. After the holiday we will resume Saturday Academy and will be running some compulsory revision sessions at the end of each day to support students at this vital time.

Return to School

After the holiday all students will return to the academy on **Tuesday 18th April.** We will be having a big drive on attendance and punctuality next half term and students' during half term 5 will be used as the criteria for the Alton Towers reward trip planned for June. It's imperative that students are in attendance every day and on time. If there are any absences, letting us know the reasons and length of absence is very helpful and ensures we can support students appropriately.

Standards and Uniform

After the half term, as is usual, we will be having a real focus on standards of uniform and ask for your support in this matter. It's vital that students meet the academy expectation regarding uniform as it helps students feel a sense of equality and belonging.
